1st Grade

Money

- Identify the name and value of a penny, nickel, dime, quarter

Mathematic Vocabulary

- Greater than and less than
- Taller/shorter, bigger/smaller and equal to

Number Sense

- Count items and write numbers
- Identify which digit is in the units place (ones) and which is in the tens place
- Play games asking questions, such as, "How many units are in 25?"

2nd Grade

Money

- Review the name and value of a penny, nickel, dime, and quarter
- Count pennies by quantity
- Count nickels (up to a dollar)
- Count dimes (up to a dollar)
- Counting quarters. (up to a dollar)

Number Sense

- Identify the value of individual digits in a number (what is the value of "2" in 25?)
- Play number games, such as, " If the number 123 was 100 more, what number would it be?"

Facts

- Memorize all numbers that add up to 10 (1+9, 2+8 etc.)
- Know addition facts 1+ through 10+

3rd Grade

Money

- Review the name and value of a penny, nickel, dime, and quarter.
- Review counting nickels dimes, and quarters

Measurement

- Read times (hour, half hour) [The app Jungle Time can assist with this.]

Facts

- [] Memorize all numbers that add up to 10
- [] Know addition and subtraction facts 1-10

Number Sense

- [] Identify the value of individual digits in a number (what is the value of "2" in 125?)
- [] Play games like, "If the number 3,123 was 100 more, what number would it be?"
